Another Blue Water Folk Society

Traditional Acoustic Coffeehouse season is finished until October 2012. Our February Coffeehouse was led by John Broadwell and the March Coffeehouse had Banjoey as the emcee. We had only 60 people and 9 performers in February (bad weather) but had about 130 people and 16 acts in March for a rousing finish to the season.

Performers in February included Ourselves (Walt, Tom and Lynn Surbrook) who surprised us with some songs from the 50's & 60's, including the Everly Brother's Dream and Bye Bye Love. Charlie Winters did "Harvest Moon" dedicated to David Rutkofske, BanJoey got the crowd singing with his group of oldtime Valentine songs, The Dalettes (Ted Smith, Roger Blume and Dale George) did Stand By Me and When You Say Nothing at All. Still Running (Jenna Reed and Mike Mercatante) were celebrating 7 years together as a group. Their Anti-Valentine songs included Harvest Moon and Under My Thumb with Jenna doing the Mick Jagger role, Dean Barnett started the second half with a spoken memorial to David Rutkofske and then performed one song, "First Thing" by Andy Mather who is also a BWFS member. Iris Spencer did a couple of numbers by Taylor Swift and Blake Shelton. John Broadwell took a turn with Lovesick Blues. Butterhair (Charlie Winters, Ted Smith and Roger Blume) closed out the night with Tamborine Man, Waterloo and a great version of Since I Fell For You sung by Ted Smith. We even had time for our usual hootenanny this night. Dean Barnett led Blowing In the Wind with all the musicians on stage and the audience singing along.

The very full March coffeehouse brought some new performers: John & the Piper (John O'Gara & Jayme Arft) with some Irish tunes; Madison Taylor with some newer music; & Terry Bennett with some Christian Music. Dean Barnett teamed with Tom McGovern on Steel Drum & Harmonica for a Dennis Kingsbury song; Bobby Budd gave us a fine story & song; Butterhair had songs from the 50's that had us singing; Al Young with Jim Williams gave us a Little Feet song; Charlie Winters did Pipeline; Ruby Hill (Ron McPhail, Jim Williams, Micky LePla) did Down to the River and others ; Roger Blume did a solo You Don't Bring Me Flowers doing both parts, bringing down the house; Tom Schlichting did some Irish tunes; Semi-Circle (Mary Foley, Dean Barnett) performed the Dutchman; Phil Larson went back to Folk roots for his songs; Mike Mercatante did a Neil Young tune, Iris Spencer did some Taylor Swift tunes | March 30 & April 27 at Studio and Val & Chuck Rushing closed out the night. Banjoey played a couple of tunes as the emcee. The 50/50 raffle was a success, thank to Ruth Habalewsky with Tania Hayes winning \$48.50 in February & Sharon Young winning \$83 in March. Dawn and Marty Malek ran the kitchen again with help from Mary Filbeck, with refreshments donated by Shirley Barnett, Jeannine Kirchoff, Ruth Habalewsky and Judy Butler & Theresa Geck.
