It has been another very successful year for the Blue Water Folk Society. Success is always a very hard thing to quantify and measure. One good way to measure success is in looking at how well the purpose of the organization has been carried out. The purpose of the Blue Water Folk Society is promoting and sponsoring traditional and acoustic music events in the Blue Water area of Michigan. For us, this includes not only performances by known and accomplished groups and artists, but also encouragement of those that are just getting started in acoustic music and those who need to hone their performance skills.

Given all that, how did we do last year?

- Our winter coffeehouse series enjoyed an excellent season with many months being close to standing room only at the church and many new performers participating. This is our primary setting for encouraging new performers and letting all levels of artist hone their stage presence in front of a large and supportive audience
- We sponsored a number of fundraising concerts this year which also were very successful and certainly would fall under the category of sponsoring music events
- Speaking of sponsoring music events, Thumbfest 2010 (despite the less than ideal weather) was a huge success with many new and very diverse performers (everything from New Orleans marching bands to African drumming and classical guitar to down and dirty blues) with excellent reviews from the thousands of people who attended.

How is a small organization able to accomplish so much? Our members and our volunteers!

- Membership has grown from 43 at this time last year to 75 currently
- Our newsletter is better than ever and is being sent to more people gaining excellent publicity for BWFS

So as I said at the beginning, it has been a very successful year for the *Blue Water Folk Society* and we have every expectation that this year will be even better.

On a side note, I have news that is both sad and happy. The sad part is that one of our founding members, *Shirley Barnett* has decided to retire from the board after many faithful years of service. We are all sad to see her go, me especially. She has been an inspiration to me from the time I first joined the group. The happy part is that she has agreed to remain active in many aspects of the group so she won't be going anywhere anytime soon.

What a flurry of activity these past several months have been in pulling together Thumbfest 2011!. Rest assured that many of us have been busy working for the past several months to put together what looks like the most exciting festival yet. It's the only place to be on Saturday, September 3.

This year marks the tenth anniversary of Thumbfest and we will be honoring the past as well as revealing glimpses of an exciting future. This year, you'll see old festival favorites mixing with new blood for a smorgasbord sure to please your musical taste buds.

We've expanded the offerings even more this year. Here is a sample:

The last two of the four *Blue Water Folk Society* Thumbfest Benefit concerts are coming up in August.

The first one will be **Saturday, August 6th** at **7:30 pm** as part of *Music in the Park* series sponsored by the *Lexington Arts Council*. The concert will feature *Circle of Friends,* a popular Peter, Paul and Mary tribute group, with *Dean Barnett* as Peter, *Mary Foley* as Mary, *George Stewart* as Paul and *Gordon MacDonald* taking the role of Dick Kniss The raffle proceeds that night will go to the Blue Water Folk Society. *Dawn and Marty Malek,* of the Blue Water Folk Society will be present to accept donations in support Thumbfest and provide information. Bring your chair and enjoy the night of music on the harbor.

The second one will be Saturday, August 13th from 7:00 - 10:00 pm as part of Music at the Harbor series in Port Sanilac. Tom Schlichting has been coordinating this concert which will have the theme Sounds of the 60's. In addition, the night will feature a raffle of a tenor banjo, kite flying before the concert which Susan Gill is organizing and a corn roast.


