Remembering George Stewart

The Blue Water Folk Society lost a Founding member when George Stewart passed away, after a long battle with Cancer, on November 23, 2011.

George was a very big part of the Blue
Water Folk Society and the Village of
Lexington, having served as a Village
Council member for many years.
Not only did George help found the Blue
Water Folk Society, but he was part of the
founding of the East River Folk Society when
he lived in Grosse Ile and the Music in the
Park summer concert series in Lexington.
George also served as a member of the
Lexington Arts Council.

In 2002, George brought the idea of the Thumbfest before the board of the BWFS. We were a very small group then, and the idea of an all day music festival seeming daunting, but with George's expert leadership, we did it!

George always thought big and helped to lead us to bigger ideas and plans. One of George's plans was to bring Tom Paxton to the area. We did that with a wonderful, intimate concert in Port Huron.

Much of the sound system that we use for the Coffeehouse Open Mic series came from George. I remember the first time we came to the Coffeehouse, before the BWFS formed, George was the person that welcomed us and helped us find a seat. That welcoming stance and his great smile was a sight to behold. The Coffeehouse Open Mic has become one of the best around, drawing musicians from all over and audiences numbering 60 to 100 each month.

George continued to perform right through his battle with leukemia with his last public performance being October 15th, 2011 with the Circle of Friends (George Stewart, Dean Barnett, Mary Foley, Gordon MacDonald) at the Baseline Folk Society in Plymouth, Mi. which was started by George's old singing partner, Mike Mullen. Mike tells us that he started it with encouragement from George. The Baseline Folk Society in Plymouth is planning a memorial concert for George on Saturday, May 19th. More details will be sent later.

George's love for Folk Music and his church were reflected with his wishes for donations in his memory be directed to the Blue Water Folk Society and Trinity Episcopal Church Miracle Fund.
George leaves his wife Cindy, his son James and his wife Kristin; his daughter Mary Steffanich and her husband Stuart and his daughter Sarah Papagelis and her husband Peter plus grandchildren lan , Alexander, Jacob, Shay, and Cole and his brother Robert and his wife Kathy.

The Blue Water Folk Society Traditional Open Mic Coffeehouses at the Trinity Episcopal Church, 5646 Main St., Lexington, Mi. 48450 are in full swing with audiences ranging from 60 to 100 or more at the January 2012. Open Mic Coffeehouse. Dawn & Marty Malek, the Coffeehouse Directors report that the emcees were Denny Dwyer in October, Shirley Barnett in November, Dean Barnett in December and Bruce Filbeck in January. Emcees will be John Broadwell in February and Banjoey in March. Sound has been ably handled by Mike Mercatante, Tom Schlichting and by George Young. Thumbfest (pdate: Jenna Reed

Even though we're a little more than half a year away, we're knee-deep in plans for Thumbfest 2012! Right now we're starting to make decisions that will shape the festival -- will it be bigger? More stages? Or more intimate? Bigger name bands? More local talent? And can we find a Coney dog vendor?!

One thing we've talked about at board meetings has been our dearth of key volunteer positions. We have a broad base of volunteers, and we rely on everyone to step up each year to do what needs to be done. And each year, you do! But there are two huge jobs we need to fill. We need an official director, and a logistics director for Thumbfest. It's not as scary as it sounds. (And, full disclosure: the week before Thumbfest, it will be eight times as scary as it sounds.)

First of all, we need someone who will keep track of all the festival details the board chooses. Someone who -- day of Thumbfest (Saturday, September 1st) -will be the "go-to" person. Troubleshoot. Answer questions (the ones we've prepped for months). Accept accolades with graciousness. This position is primarily advance work and coordination -- someone who is willing to keep track of what the artistic director, publicity crew, marketing and planning groups are doing. Remind us what we already promised to do. Someone who can make sure there's a schedule to follow, and make sure that schedule is met. George Stewart filled this role for many years, and we'd love to find someone willing to be "the guy/gal" who's willing to plan the day of Thumbfest.

And we need a logistics director. This person we need above all else. We need someone with roots in the Lexington area. Someone who knows the scene. Someone who, when someone runs up on Thumbfest morning because we don't have power to stages, will say, "oh, sure. I'll call.... well, I'll call somebody." Someone who then calls somebody. Someone who knows somebody with a truck. Somebody who gets stuff done. This is the person who makes sure ahead of time that we have places to put the stages, that we've lined up sound gear, and that the electricity works and people go where they're supposed to go on the day of Thumbfest. This is the person who troubleshoots on the ground the day of Thumbfest. Gene Butler did this amazingly in years past.

Both positions come with **full** support of the board and the cadre of volunteers we have. If you think you might have time and energy to devote to either of these positions, please email back, or shout up at one of the Trinity coffeehouses (second Saturday of winter months). Even if you have questions, or think you might be able to do either of these jobs, please let us know. People who have done these jobs in the past will prep and coach you.

Contact: board@bluewaterfolk.org if you want to help. Editors Note: Tom Schlichting, Mike Tremblay and Shirley Barnett have also filled these roles in the past, along with the Board. Being from Lexington does help in knowing who to contact but is not always necessary. This is **YOUR** chance to become a bigger part of Thumbfest!!
