Our very popular Open Mic Coffeehouse begins again on October 8, 2016 at 7:00pm.

The Traditional Acoustic Open Mic coffeehouse series takes place monthly from October through March on the second Saturday of the Month. It begins at 7:00pm and ends at 10:00pm. It takes place at Trinity Episcopal Church, 5646 Main St., Lexington, Michigan. Admission is free to everyone but, donations are very appreciated.

Refreshments are available by donation and are provided by the Bluewater Folk Society and prepared and served by volunteers. A 50/50 Raffle is held to benefit the Blue Water Folk Society and it's project. In addition, non-perishable food is collected to benefit Project Blessing.

We welcome you to come perform. An open mic is great for those at all skill levels. Sign up for performers began at 6:15pm in the past. The emcee for the night will set the order of play. Slots of 10 minutes are available on a first come, first serve basis until all available slots are gone.

You will range from classical, country, gospel, folk, traditional, the 20's to the present. A complete sound system is provided with vocal and instrument microphones along with direct boxes. The only thing you need to bring is your **acoustic** instruments and a song or two.

A Little Thumbfest History

The <u>first Thumbfest</u> was on the Saturday of Labor Day weekend, 2002. It was held at Camp Ozanam, a private campground located on Lake Huron about seven miles north of Lexington. Admission to Thumbfest while at Camp Ozanam was \$10 per person. We had about 300 paid admission in 2002 growing to 1000 paid admissions in 2004. In 2005, the festival moved to it's present location in Lexington, Michigan. Since it's inception, the goal of the festival has been to present a wide variety of acoustic and traditional music to as many people as possible. Through the years Thumbfest has continued to be a peoples festival. Attendance has grown to 5000 +. It is now a free festival open to anyone coming to the Village of Lexington. It is made possible by donations on the day of the event, fund raisers throughout the year, sponsorship by local businesses, musicians, numerous volunteers, the Village of Lexington funds for Thumbfest. The festival provides handicap access, parking, and a shuttle service. Lexington, located along beautiful Lake Huron, features unique shops and fine dining, as well as the convenient harbor and beaches. There are multiple stages, workshops, jam sites, Guitars for Kids giveaway, children's stage area, dance, craft/food vendors and a Hootenanny at the end of the night.
